Message from Rabbi Norm Roman

"Someone has Died . . ."

A What/When/How Discussion – June 23rd

Dear Friends,

Just about 3 years ago, when Lynne and I were planning our move to Green Valley from Michigan, Merle Sobel said to me, "Rabbi, when you come to BSTC, you won't have very many Bar or Bat Mitzvahs, and probably not too many weddings, either. But be prepared for quite a few funerals!" Fortunately, he was wrong about the number of deaths we've experienced in this community; but he was correct in saying that we all should be prepared.

My Rabbi while I was growing up in Cleveland, Philip Horowitz (of blessed memory), always referred to "death as part of life's economy". It is often an unwelcome reality, and sometimes it truly is a blessing. We have all been in the situation, at one or another time in our lives, when we have been among those who grieve, and, I know, we have all been supporters of those who are bereaved. We hide or share our emotions, we search for answers, and we pray that we will find the strength to carry on.

Jewish tradition, representing centuries of wisdom and painful experiences, can help. The Temple Community, being close in moments of need, can help. And I, the Rabbi, am here to guide you through the sorrow as much as possible. But we, in Green Valley, are in a unique situation – there isn't a "Jewish" Funeral Home in the neighborhood to handle arrangements, many of our families live hundreds if not thousands of miles away, and many of our closest and strongest connections here are with non-Jews, who aren't knowledgeable about the specific, sacred customs of "End of Life" practices in our faith.

With all of this in mind, I have been asked to develop a Discussion opportunity (this will probably be the first of several).



The Speaker: David H. Levy is one of the most successful comet discoverers in history. He has discovered 22 comets, nine of them using his own backyard telescopes. With Eugene and Carolyn Shoemaker, at the Palomar Observatory in California, he discovered Shoemaker-Levy 9, the comet that collided with Jupiter in 1994. Levy is currently involved with the Jarnac Comet Survey, which is based at the Jarnac Observatory in Vail, Arizona, but which has telescopes planned for locations around the world.

SECURITY

- ◆ If you are at a temple service or event and need to leave the building before it concludes, PLEASE contact the security shomer, so he or she can let you out. The security shomer will be located in the back corner nearest to the sanctuary exit door. If you are coming into the Temple after the beginning of a service or event please knock on the door and the security shomer will unlock the door and let you in. **We are seeking volunteers to share the Shomer duties!** Shomers must commit to arriving 30 minutes prior to the services or event for which they volunteer, and short on-the-job training will be provided.

- ◆ We have completed and submitted a request for a grant from the regional JFSA for up to \$5000 support for security improvement. The awards will be announced in early June. A larger grant application from the federal Homeland Security Office has also been submitted. Both these grants are very competitive.
- ◆ Our new BSTC Guide for Emergency Safety Procedures is completed but will always be open to revision as we collectively identify the need for revision. This guide is posted in the "members only access" portion of the BSTC website for your ease of access. We will also conduct training on short portions of the guide periodically to help all of us better understand the content.
- ◆ Please **wear your nametag** whenever you are at BSTC for services or events. Thank you.
